FUNDING

\$75,000 per year for a period of 4 years. (Total: \$300,000)

NOMINATION LIMITATION

Yale University may nominate one candidate.

PURPOSE

This award is intended to provide assured support for young investigators of outstanding promise as contributors in science relevant to advancing human health. Strong proposals will demonstrate particularly creative and innovative approaches. Candidates whose work is based on biomedical principles, but brings in concepts and theories from more diverse fields, are encouraged to apply. Risk-taking is encouraged. In evaluating applicants, considerable weight is given to evidence that the candidate is an independent investigator as shown by notable past accomplishments, including honors, awards, and significant published work.

ELIGIBILITY

- Individuals with the doctorate in medicine, biomedical sciences, or a related field.
- As of October 15, 2018, candidates must hold full-time appointments as assistant professor on the Yale faculty.
- On June 29, 2018, candidates shall not have been in such appointments for more than 3 years, (appointed not earlier than June 29, 2015) whether or not such appointments were on a tenure track. This time may have been spent at more than 1 institution. Time spent in clinical internships, residencies, or in work toward board certification does not count as part of this 3-year limit.
- Funding from the NIH, other government sources, and project grants from non-profit associations do not pose a conflict with the Pew Scholars Program. (This "no conflicts" policy supersedes past policies regarding other awards.)
- The National Advisory Committee gives considerable weight to evidence that the candidate is an independent investigator and to significant published work.
